Meet Tom and Holly. One couple, one relationship, two very different perspectives on what's really happening as everything begins to implode.

<u>Kaleidoscopes</u> is a play about gaslighting: an extremely common, but little talked about, facet of emotional abuse in which the abuser manipulates the reality of their victim making them question their own behaviour and actions. How can we ever know the truth about what goes on behind closed doors? Why do we perceive some testimonies as true, and others as false? And can we ever be sure of whose story we're being told?

Tom Shah - Tom

Tom trained at ArtsEd, graduating in 2014. Previous roles include: Claudio in *Much Ado About Nothing*, Richard Hannay in *The 39 Steps*, Heathcliff in *Isabella (A Wuthering Heights Adaptation),* Abel in *Cain* and Cassio in *Othello*. Tom is also a member of Althea Theatre, appearing in 2016's *One Last Thing (For Now)*. He has spent much of the last year working in rep in Spain.

Becky Black - Holly

Since graduating from the BA Acting course at Mountview, Becky's acting credits include: Beatrix Potter at The Old Laundry Theatre in *Where is Peter Rabbit?*, Beti in the English language world premiere of *Darwin's Tortoise* at the new Cervantes Theatre, Banquo in *Macbeth* at The New Wimbledon Studio with Arrows and Traps Theatre Company, Juliet and Benvolio in *Romeo and Juliet* for The Young Shakespeare Company, Young Woman in *Knives in Hens* directed by Paula Paz. She also works as a workshop facilitator and currently leads workshops at Mountview Academy of Theatre Arts and directs at Identity School of Acting and the National Youth Theatre.

Isabel Dixon - Writer

Isabel Dixon is a playwright from the South West, now based in London. She is the recipient of the 2019 Off West End Adopt a Playwright Award and is currently developing her new play *Kaleidoscopes*. Isabel trained on the Royal Court Young Writers Programme, Lyric Hammersmith Writers Group and Soho Theatre Writers Lab. Her work has been performed, read and/or developed at theatres including the Old Vic, the Arcola, RichMix and BAFTA. She was shortlisted for the Old Vic 12 in 2018 and 2019, and was the recipient of the 2015 Jack Wills Young Brit Award bursary for creativity.
